WARTIME CHOCOLATE CAKE				
ngredients 2 Dessertspoons of Cocoa				
6oz Self Raising Flour	2 Dessertspoons of Vinegar			
3oz Castor Sugar	2 Dessertspoons of Syrup			
3oz Marg or Lard	1 Teaspoon of Bicarbonate of Soda dissolved			
	Into 1 teacup of cold milk			
Melt Marg and Syrup in Pan				
Mix dry ingredients, add vinegar, then contents of pan and milk and soda last.				
This makes a very soft mixture.				
Put in 8" round deep tin and bake in moderate oven for 45 mins				
Eggs not forgotten – there are none in recipe				

FISHERMEN'S WOOLLEN HAT

Knitted in Double Knitting or 4 Ply Wool; Size 8 (4mm) Needles 2oz Wool

TO BE DONATED

Cast on 120 Stitches

Rib – 2 knit/2 purl – for 12 inches

Next Row – Knit 2 together to end of the row

Next Row - Purl

Repeat these 2 rows once more

Next Row – Knit

Next Row – Purl

Pull thread through all stitches and sew up seam
